Lewis Christie, wore #66, will have his jersey retired in recognition of his exceptional career spanning over 16 seasons with the Lightning. Joining the team in 2008 after stints with the Dundee Stars, Edinburgh Capitals, and Belfast Giants, Christie quickly grew into a cornerstone of the MK Lightning and became respected league wide as a consistent stay at home defenceman who put the team first before himself.

With an impressive record of 621 appearances - the most in MK Lightning history - Christie's combination of skill and leadership shone brightly during his final playing season, where he captained the team to a National Cup victory in 2024. And whether he's been captain or not, its been clear to see Lewy's influence on team culture and his support and mentorship of younger players as they progress.

Reflecting on his journey, Christie remarked, "It's an absolute honour to have my shirt retired up in the rafters, especially as it is going to be up there alongside some of my teammates who I played with for most of my career. Milton Keynes will always hold a special place in my heart, and that is due to the incredible fans, the players, and the owners of the team. I am forever grateful for the team and the opportunities it has given me, not only to have been out there week on week playing the sport I love but also for the lifelong friendships I have made. I look forward to being able to come and watch the team play and support from the stands.'


